# **Our Local Chapter**


Seeing a need for a local chapter that would benefit accountants and auditors in




What are the costs for servicing the chapter's members and how are those costs paid?

## **Revenue by Source (unaudited)**

Of the \$1,479 in total revenue in FY 2016, 82 percent is made up of meeting and seminar fees, and the remaining 18 percent is made up of chapter dues. In an effort to increase attendance at dinners or events, we did not charge any fees.



# What's Next Challenges Moving Forward

The Northern New Jersey Chapter is continuously looking to be creative by introducing college students and early career members to the AGA. We are looking for involvement by early career members as well as students on our Board or on various committees. As a relatively small chapter we will continue to provide quality education to the community and provide donations and volunteer effort to various charities within the Northern New Jersey and surrounding area. During these tough economic times, we plan on providing seminars and meetings at a very reasonable cost to the professionals, students and retirees within the accounting field. Our Challenges in detail are shown below.

#### Membership Retention

Over the past few years we have seen our membership numbers decrease. It is our challenge to develop programs that will convince former members to rejoin and attract young professionals.

#### Education

Identifying and scheduling quality speakers for the various educational events can pose a challenge. As budgets get tighter, it is important to show that our educational activities are timely, relevant, and economical training opportunities.

#### **Leadership Position Opening**

While we have been successful in recruiting many young professionals to leadership positions, our Chapter President serves a two year term instead of a one year term. We would like to go back to a one year Presidential term in the future.

#### Location, Location

Since our Chapter encompasses the Northern New Jersey area, and a portion of our membership works in New York, there is no true downtown area to have meetings. We tend to have more meetings during the evening hours rather than around lunch time. Our Chapter holds seminars in Newark, and meetings in Clifton, Kearney or Lyndhurst, NJ.
